- Neil Cordell has continued as Acting Treasurer

Contribution of Volunteers:

• Including the RO Team Members above, 26 people have contributed a total of 4390 hours to the Region's activities, roughly the equivalent of 2.5 FTEs!

Membership of the Region

 at 31/12/2016 was 1,337. On 31/12/2017 it was 1,318, a decrease of 19. London Region accounts for over 13% of the UK Members, 11% of total Membership.

Attendance at Activities

- 390 people attended one or more activities in the Region
- 73% were Members, 27% were not.

- Managed and supported the Distinctions Advisory Programme in London
- Managed/co-ordinated and led our regular Micro-Groups (Street, LN, Bookworms, SE & SW London)

- Acted as Mentors both at Café Art and to colleagues
- Worked on internal projects such as our Marketing Communications Strategy

- Initiated and managed marketing events for the Region and the RPS as a whole,
 e.g. our stand at CameraWorld in November
- Supported RPS HQ at Exhibitions in the Region such as IPE at Truman's Brewery
- Supported RPS as a whole for example by sitting on the Investment Committee
- Co-ordinated all the above activities, kept records, liaised with Bath, updated the website, represented the Region and occasionally the RPS,

Breathing London:

- Walks continued during Jan/Feb/Mar and April
- 2-day Pop-up Exhibition held in Greenwich 11 & 12
 Feb
- Final Workshops with Robert Canis held on 3 April
- Photography completed April 2017 with a final event in Hyde Park
- Final Exhibition at the Croatian Embassy 18 July to 11 August
- 70 active participants (all had pictures in the Final Exhibition)
- 7000 images uploaded to the website

RO's Report – Projects

Crossrail/Elizabeth Line:

- Purpose of the project:
 - To create a photobook illustrating 'life' on the surface directly over and close by Crossrail tunnels, together with photographs on the line and in some new stations
- 16 photographers took part
- 1800 photographs submitted from Spring to end October
- Book was progressive throughout with editing and design by Brian Steptoe FRPS
- Published in early December (available from the RPS Shop!)
- 'Taster' Exhibition at the Whitechapel Gallery January 2018 with main Exhibition in Greenwich in April 2018

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Celebrating London

- Purpose of the project:

Financial Headlines: FY 2017

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- London Region is on a good financial footing
- Balance at end of Financial Year (after accruals)
 - 2017 £3,980.37
 - 2016 £3,549.79
- Membership subscriptions assigned to the region only amount to £1,938.65 based on 1337 members
- Distinctions have been very successful making profit of £1,571.10
- Most events has been successfully run on a break-event basis with two notable exceptions:
 - Joint "Harry Borden" event with City of London & Cripplegate PS made a loss of £155
 - "Alixandra Fazzina" event cancelled due to a lack of interest made a loss of £125
- Major projects are expensive but thanks to a number of members for their kind donations to support them
