Preparing images

Using Photoshop or any other suitable program adjust your image size so that the longest side is no greater than 500 pixels. Save your image as a jpeg file. Choose a compression value that keeps the final file size below 100K. In Photoshop the Save for Web option is useful to judge the best compression.
